

An Ordinance to permit the running at large of Swine during Certain Months of the year.

Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That it shall be lawful for Swine to go at large in any part of the City of Baltimore within the limits of direct taxation at all times between the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year, including the present, and that no forfeiture or penalty shall be incurred by any person in consequence of any Swine going at large within the periods of time above specified, any thing in any Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding.

An Ordinance Relative to the Improvement of the Navigation of the River Susquehanna.

Whereas, The General Assembly of Maryland at December Session 1821, passed an Act, entitled "An Act for the Improvement of the Navigation of the River Susquehanna", wherein among other things it was enacted that the Act should take effect and go into Operation as soon as the Mayor and City Council would transmit to the Governor and Council their formal assent thereto, otherwise to be of no force or value whatever. Therefore,

1. Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the assent of this Corporation be and hereby is given to the Act of the General Assembly, entitled "An Act for the Improvement of the Navigation of the River Susquehanna".

II. And be it enacted and Ordained, That the Mayor be, and he hereby is requested to transmit to the Governor and Council a Certified Copy of this Ordinance under the Seal of the Corporation, as soon as the same may be approved by him.

A Supplement to an Ordinance, entitled "A further Supplement to the Ordinance, entitled 'An Ordinance for preserving the Health of the City'."

1. Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Ordinance, entitled, "A further Supplement to the Ordinance, entitled 'An Ordinance for preserving the Health of the City,'" approved on the 3^d day of December 1821, be and the same is hereby declared to be in full force and effect, and the City Commissioners and Port Wardens, and all other Officers of this Corporation concerned are hereby authorized and required to proceed to carry the same into full effect.

II. And be it enacted and Ordained, That as soon as the pavement contemplated by said Ordinance shall have been completed, it shall be the duty of the Collector of the City to proceed to collect from the several property holders affected thereby, their proportion of the expense, being half, as provided by the first section of said Ordinance, and to proceed to enforce payment of the same as is provided in the ninth section of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to appoint City Commissioners, and prescribing their duties."

A Supplement to an Ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance for the Continuance and further extension of Gas light through the Squares, Streets, Lanes and Alleys of the City of Baltimore," Approved 27th March, 1818.

1. Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Mayor in conjunction with the Presidents of the First and Second Branches of the City Council, or either of them, be and they are hereby authorized to contract with the Gas Light Company, for fitting up and lighting as many of the public lamps as they may deem expedient, on such Squares, Streets, Lanes and Alleys where the said Company now have or may hereafter extend their pipes, upon such terms as may in their judgment
