

the same day in each and every year, until the aforesaid work is completed, make out an estimate of the expense incurred by the Corporation in filling up the lots of each and every proprietor of ground aforesaid, and they shall place such amount or estimate of expense in the hands of the City Collector for the time being, who shall proceed forthwith to collect the same in the same manner that the City taxes are collected, from the respective Owners or Owners of property so filled up, which sums of money the Collector shall pay over, when collected, to the Register of the City after deducting three and a half per Centum Commission therefrom.

VI. And be it enacted and Ordained, That the City Commissioners and Wardens of the port, with the approbation of the Mayor, are hereby authorized to draw on the Register of the City for such sums of money as may be necessary to carry the provisions of this Ordinance into effect. Provided, such sum or sums of money shall not exceed two thousand five hundred dollars in any one year, the same to be paid out of the Harbour Appropriation.

A Supplement to an Ordinance entitled  
"An Ordinance for Completing the Baltimore Monument."

1. Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore. That the Register of the City of Baltimore be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to the Superintendants of the Baltimore Monument, such sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole, the sum of four thousand dollars, in manner following, that is to pay, One thousand dollars within six months, and thousand dollars within twelve months, and the residue within eighteen months from the date of this Ordinance, to pay and discharge any debt heretofore contracted, or <sup>that</sup> may hereafter be contracted for the erection and completion of the said monument.

II. And be it enacted and Ordained, That the City Commissioners with the advice and consent of the Mayor, be and they are hereby authorized and directed to grade Calvert Street from Church Street to Market

Street in such manner as to make the side of the Baltimore Monument the apex of said Street, and that the Register be authorized and directed to pay to the Commissioners a sum not exceeding four hundred dollars to carry into effect the said alteration; Provided all the Owners of property to be effected thereby, assent thereto in writing, and provided also that any additional funds necessary therefor be by them first raised and paid into the City Treasury.

III. And be it enacted and Ordained. That so much of the Ordinance to which this is a supplement as authorizes the said Superintendants to appropriate the Theatrical Fund for the purpose of completing said Monument, and to borrow the sum of three thousand dollars, and to pledge the receipts arising from said Theatrical Fund to the discharge of the interest arising thereon, and so much of all other Ordinances or Resolutions as are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same is hereby repealed.

IV. And be it enacted and Ordained. That a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars, be, and the same is hereby appropriated for the year 1825, to the use of the Widows and Orphans of those who fell at the Battle of Bladensburg, North Point and the bombardment of Fort M<sup>c</sup>Henry, and the Register be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay the same out of the Theatrical Fund aforesaid.
