

to the Baltimore and Starford Turnpike Road, and with said
Road to the intersection of Starford Street aforesaid.

The Fifth Ward to comprise all that part of the City from
Jones Falls westward to Gay Street.

The Sixth Ward to comprise all that part of the City westward
from Gay Street and Jones Falls to Calvert Street.

The Seventh Ward to comprise all that part of the City
westward from Calvert Street and Jones Falls to Charles Street
as low down as the intersection of ^{thence with Mine Alley} Mine Alley, in its several
directions to Light Street, down Light Street to Pratt Street and
with said Street or basin to Calvert Street aforesaid.

The Eighth Ward, to comprise all that part of the City
southwardly from the Intersection of Charles Street and Wine
Alley aforesaid to Barre Street up Barre Street to Goodman
Street, thence with Goodman Street to Ridgely Cove thence with
meanders of the water, including Fort St. Henry and Whetstone
point to the head of the basin, along the head of said basin
to Pratt Street thence up Light Street to the intersection of Wine
Alley and with said Alley in its several directions to Charles
Street the place of beginning.

The Ninth Ward to comprise all that part of the City
westward of Goodman Street and Charles Street connected
with Barre Street to the Intersection of Conewago Street,
along Conewago Street to Vulcan Avenue, down said Avenue
to Chatham Street, up Chatham Street to McClellans Alley
down said Alley to Baltimore Street, up Baltimore Street
to Sharp Street, thence with Sharp Street to Timber Neck Lane
thence with Timber Neck Lane to Chestnut Street (Ridgely's addition)
and with said Street to Ridgely Cove.

The Tenth Ward, to comprise all that part of the City
westward from the limits aforesaid of the Ninth Ward and
Charles Street to Jones Falls, with said Falls to the Northern
or boundary line of the City, along said line to the Falls
turnpike road and with the said Road to Bolton Street, thence
to Howard Street and down Howard Street to Paca Street
(Ridgely's addition) thence to Ridgely Cove.

The Eleventh Ward to comprise all that part of the City
westwardly from the limits aforesaid, to the following Streets
viz John Street from its intersection with Ridgely Cove, Eutaw
Street, Pratt Street, Paca Street and Popo Street to the northern
limits of the City.

The Twelfth Ward to comprise all that part of the
City westwardly from the limits last aforesaid to northern
and westerly limits of the City.

Sec. II. And be it enacted and Ordained, that the several
plans prepared by Thomas St. Popleton under the direction of
Commissioners in pursuance of a Resolution of the Corporation by
which the boundaries of the several wards are specially delimited
be and the same are hereby ratified and adopted as the true
and correct division of the City into twelve wards, and that the
provisions of this Ordinance be construed to conform to the
delimitations in the plans aforesaid.

An Ordinance for the Inspection of Pot and Pearl Ashes.

Sec. I. Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and
City Council of Baltimore, that a person well skilled in the quality
of pot and pearl ashes be annually appointed Inspector thereof for
the City of Baltimore, who shall not directly or indirectly by himself
or any other person or persons for him speculate in or monopolize the
Articles of Pot and Pearl ashes during the time he continues In-
spector of the same, or his own account or upon the account of any
other person or persons whomsoever under the penalty of One
hundred dollars for every such offence.

Sec. II. And be it enacted and Ordained, that the Inspector be
and he is hereby authorized to rent at his own expence, a House
in some part of the City convenient to Navigation for the purpose of
inspecting Pot and Pearl Ashes, and when any Pot or Pearl ashes
shall be brought to the City in Cask or Casks, it shall be the
duty of the person or persons by whom it is brought to notify the
Inspector of its arrival, as soon as practicable thereafter; and it
shall moreover be the duty of any and every person or persons
in whose possession it may be to carry the same to the inspection
House within five days after its arrival, for the purpose of
undergoing inspection, and any person who shall violate the
provisions of this section shall forfeit and pay the sum of five
dollars for each and every day that such neglect or refusal, shall
continue.

Sec. III. And be it enacted, that it shall be the duty of the
said Inspector to start all pot or pearl ashes out of the Casks
and carefully examine, try and inspect the same, and sort it
into three different qualities if necessary, and shall put each sort
