

and subject to the penalty imposed by Ordinance.
Sec. IV. And be it enacted and Ordained, that all buildings erected in this City with Brick or Stone shall be finished with parapet or fire walls on the Gable ends and dividing walls, or shall be so covered with Slate or stone as to break the communication from one roof to another

Sec. V. And be it enacted and Ordained, that whenever hereafter any brick or stone building already erected shall be newly roofed or covered, it shall be finished with parapet or fire walls, or covered with Slate or stone, as new buildings are directed to be done by the preceding Section.

Sec. VI. And be it enacted and Ordained, that every person or persons offending against the provisions of the fourth and fifth sections of this Ordinance, shall forfeit and pay a fine of One hundred dollars, and the further sum of ten dollars for each and every month thereafter, until the provisions of this Ordinance shall be complied with.

Sec. VII. And be it enacted and Ordained, that it shall not be lawful to make or cause to be made any fire for the purpose of smoking or causing to be smoked any bacon or other meat in any warehouse or other building, except houses built expressly for that purpose and made secure, so as not to endanger the adjoining property, and every person offending against the provisions of this Section shall forfeit and pay the sum of Twenty dollars, and the further sum of ten dollars for each and every day the practice shall be continued.

Sec. VIII. And be it enacted and Ordained, that no person or persons shall be permitted to hang or place any lamp or light as a sign or otherwise on the outside of any wooden building, unless such lamp be made of the same materials as the City lamps, and placed at the distance of two feet six inches from any such wooden building; any person or persons offending against the provisions of this Section, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding five dollars for every such offence, and five dollars per day for every day they shall permit such lamp to remain thereafter, one half to the informer, the other half to the use of the City.

Sec. IX. And be it enacted and Ordained, that no person shall erect or continue erected any chimney or stove within this City, in such a manner as the smoke

thereof shall annoy any neighbour or the Citizens in passing, and upon the complaint of any two Citizens thereof to the Mayor he shall at his discretion order the same to be altered or removed and if any person shall neglect or refuse to obey such Order, such person shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten dollars, and the like sum for each and every week thereafter until such order shall be obeyed, and no person shall erect a stove and conduct the pipe thereof through the side or end of any wooden house; or the roof, or wooden ceiling of any building under the penalty of forfeiting a sum not exceeding ten dollars, and shall forfeit and pay the same sum for each and every month thereafter until such pipe shall be removed.

Sec. X. And be it enacted and Ordained, that if any person shall cast, throw or fire any squib, rocket, crackers or other combustible fire works within the City of Baltimore, every such person for every such offence shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding five dollars.

Sec. XI. And be it enacted and Ordained, that if any person or persons shall carry a lighted candle or lamp into any stable or make use of it there unless the same is well secured in a tin, stone or glass lantern, or shall keep ashes in barrels, boxes, or wooden vessels of any kind in any dwelling house, warehouse or other building, or on any wooden floor shall forfeit and pay five dollars.

Sec. XII. And be it enacted and Ordained, that if any person shall willfully or carelessly break, injure, destroy or carry away, any fire engine or any of the apparatus or implements belonging thereto, or commonly used by a fire company in the prevention and extinguishment of fire or in saving of property at the time of fire, every person so offending or aiding in such offence shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty dollars.

Sec. XIII. And be it enacted and Ordained, that if at the time of fire it shall be found necessary for the constant or convenient working of fire or other engines, or for the better and more effectual preservation of property at such times that idle or disorderly persons should be kept at or removed to a convenient distance from such fire or property, the persons in the several fire companies, denominated Directors, or any of them shall have authority so to order and direct, and to form a line or lines for that purpose, and every person refusing to comply with such direction, or willfully breaking through, or passing such line, or aiding therein, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty dollars, and for the more
