

Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore that the City Commissioners be and they are hereby authorized with the approbation of the Mayor to repair the buildings at Calvert Street Spring, provided that the Expenses shall not exceed One hundred and twenty dollars.

Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, that the Register be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to John Bouldin, the sum of two hundred Eighty seven dollars and fifty Cents in full satisfaction for services rendered in surveying and drawing plans for a still water navigation from Baltimore to the mouth of the Susquehanna, under the direction of the Commissioners appointed by the Mayor, agreeably to a Resolution approved 10th September 1824 (Eighteen hundred and twenty four).

An Ordinance Relative to Starford Run.

Sec. I. Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, that it shall be lawful for the stream of water commonly called Starford Run, to flow from the Stone Bridge at Pitt Street, through the Canal, through which it now flows to the Basin.

Sec. II. And be it enacted and Ordained, that the City Commissioners with the approbation of the Mayor, be and they are hereby authorized and required to continue the Canal in Starford Street upon the plan and of the height of that part now finished southwardly to Wilky Street, and to draw upon the Register for the expenses thereof, as the same shall become necessary

and the Register shall pay the same out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, Provided that the Commissioners do not expend more than One thousand dollars in any one year.

An Ordinance relative to the Trustees of the House of Industry.

Sec. I. Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, that the Mayor and the Presidents of the two Branches, be and they are hereby requested to appoint one person from each ward of the City to act as trustee to the House of Industry, the Trustees aforesaid to be appointed by the Mayor and Presidents biennially, five of whom shall be a quorum.

Sec. II. And be it enacted and Ordained, that the Mayor of the City be ex officio President of the Board of Trustees, and that the Mayor and Trustees be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to appoint a Treasurer or and Secretary from their own body or otherwise and to appoint all such other Officers as they may deem necessary to carry into effect the objects of this Trust.

An Ordinance to preserve the Health of the City of Baltimore and for the due performance of Quarantine at the Port of Baltimore.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, that there shall be annually appointed Three Commissioners of Health and one Consulting Physician, and that the said Commissioners shall, and form the Board of Health, and the Commissionery of Health, with the approbation of the Mayor are hereby authorized and directed to lay off and divide
