

the quarantine ground; and if any pilot or other person having command as aforesaid shall bring such vessel nearer the City than the quarantine ground, or he or any person on board (not in perfect health) shall leave such vessel and come within the City before the Health Officer has been on board, and giving him, her or them permission in writing, he, she or they shall forfeit and pay for every such offence the sum of One hundred dollars, and if any person shall go on board or have communication in any manner, otherwise than by speaking, with any such vessel and the persons on board before he hath obtained permission from the Health Officer in writing, he shall forfeit and pay for every such offence One hundred dollars.

Sec. XLV. And be it enacted and Ordained that every person keeping a Tavern, Boarding or Lodging House in the City, shall between the first day of June and the first day of November, within twenty four hours after any sea-faring man or sejourner shall become sick in such Tavern, Boarding and Lodging house, report in writing the name of such diseased person to the Mayor or Board of Health, and no Master of a Vessel or other person whatever, shall remove from any vessel lying in the Harbour of Baltimore, any sick person before such person has been visited by the Consulting Physician or some Member of the Board of Health and a written permit granted them or either of them, and any person neglecting or refusing to comply with the provisions of this Section shall be subject to a fine not exceeding Twenty dollars for each and every offence.

Sec. XLVI. And be it enacted and Ordained, that all fines and forfeitures imposed by this Ordinance shall be appropriated as follows, viz One half to the informer, and the other half to the use of the Corporation; provided that no Officer appointed by virtue of this ordinance shall receive any part of the fines and forfeitures therein imposed.

Sec. XLVII. And be it enacted and Ordained, that the Pottery Fields of Baltimore be and they are hereby placed under the controul and direction of the Commissioners of Health, who, or a majority thereof, are hereby authorised, with the advise and consent of the Mayor, to establish a code of regulations relative to all interments in said Pottery Fields which

in their judgment may be proper and necessary.

An additional Supplement to An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance for completing the Battle Monument."

Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, that the ^{City} Commissioners with the advice and consent of the Mayor, be and they are hereby authorised and directed to regrade Calvert Street from a range with the south line of the Mechanics Bank and to extend fifty feet north of the Baltimore Monument making the apex of said street about forty five feet south of the Monument, provided that the said Commissioners shall not exceed the appropriation made by the Supplement to the original Ordinance, and provided all the owners of property to be effected thereby assent thereto in writing and pay into the City Treasury any additional fund that may be necessary to complete the work.

An Ordinance, authorising the erection and removal of Lamps.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted and Ordained, by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, that it shall be the duty of the City Commissioners with the approbation of the Mayor, to have lamps erected in the following places, viz three Lamps on Siffy Street west of Jones Falls and South of Pratt Street, One, South End of Bond Street on Chappley corner, one at the intersection of Point and Philpot Streets North East corner, One East side of High Street between
