Sec II. And be it enacted and Ordained, that the City
 Commissioners with the approbation of the Mayor are hereby
 authorised and directed to remove all such lamps as they
 may think have been improperly placed, to such other
 situation as they may deem most conducive to the public
 convenience.

Sec III. And be it enacted and Ordained, that
 the sum of three hundred and twenty six dollars are hereby
 appropriated to carry this Ordinance into effect and the
 City Commissioners with the approbation of the Mayor are
 hereby authorised to draw on the Register of the City for the
 same to be paid out of any money in the Treasury not
 otherwise appropriated.
