N^o 126 Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore that the Board of Health be and they are hereby directed to give the usual notice to the owner or owners of a lot of ground bounded by Stiles, Trench and Canal Streets and Allen Alley, to have the same filled up and so regulated as will remove the nuisance now existing there, according to the provisions of Ordinance N^o 28.

N^o 127. Resolved by both branches of the City Council, that the directors on the part of the City of Baltimore, in the board of directors of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company be, and they are hereby requested to vote in favor of the subscription of eight hundred thousand dollars to the stock of the Pittsburgh and Connorsville Rail Road Company for the purpose aforesaid, said subscription to take effect when the sum of seven hundred and fifty thousand dollars shall have been subscribed by the citizens of Pittsburgh, Connorsville, West Newton and of such other places along the route wherever books may be opened for the purpose of receiving subscriptions to the stock of said Company, - and when the citizens of Baltimore, in their individual capacity shall have sub-

scribed not less than four hundred thousand dollars of additional stock to the said Pittsburgh and Connorsville Rail Road Company, provided that said directors before giving their votes as aforesaid, shall ascertain that by the provisions of the terms on which said subscription is made, full and ample protection is secured to the interests of the City of Baltimore, in relation to the routes and termini of said road, and in all other necessary provisions, as well, in their judgment, most effectually secure such protection.

Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, that the City Commissioners be and they are hereby directed to place a fire plug on the South West corner of Sharp and Camden Streets - and that the sum of seventy five dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the annual appropriation for fire plugs, to pay for the same.

N^o 129. Whereas it is understood that the President of the United States will on Tuesday next pass through this City on his way to the North and in every point of view, it is right and proper that he should be received with all appropriate honors, therefore be it

Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore that a committee of three members of each branch be appointed by the respective presidents thereof, who, in conjunction with the Mayor, shall make every arrangement to welcome cordially the Chief Magistrate, as the guest of the City, in the name of all our people.
