36. *Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore,* That the City Commissioners be and they are hereby instructed to place new ladles at the spring in Calvert street, and to make such further repairs at said spring as may appear to them to be requisite, not exceeding an expense of twelve dollars, and the Register is hereby authorized to pay, with the approbation of the Mayor, the sum of twelve dollars to the City Commissioners, to carry the above resolution into effect.

38. *Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore,* That the Harbor Master be, and he is hereby directed to demand and collect the wharfage from all persons occupying the wharf, known by the name of Oliver's wharf, in conformity with the plat marked J. R., and agreeably to the Ordinance, approved, 10th November, 1821, and an Ordinance, approved November 19th, 1821.

39. *Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore,* That the Port Wardens be and they are hereby directed to have one hundred feet of the old wharf logs on the east side of McElderry's dock removed, and a good and substantial stone wall built in lieu thereof, to connect with that part built last year, and they are hereby authorized to draw on the Register of the City, with the approbation of the Mayor, for the sum of one thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary to carry this Resolution into effect. One hundred

and fifty dollars of this sum to pay a balance due for the work done last year, the same to be paid out of the appropriation for the harbor.

*And be it further resolved,* That the City Commissioners be and they are hereby directed to sell the sand which is now in the bed of Hughes's street, and dispose of the same in such manner as in their judgment will promote the interests of the public, and the proceeds of the same to be applied to the improvement of said street. 42. *Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore,* That Eisler street, from Sterret street to Cove street, and Saint Peter street, from Sterret street to Perry street, be and the same is hereby condemned as a public highway, and as such shall be subject to all the Ordinances and regulations of this Corporation; provided always that the owners of the fee simple estate in the ground over and on which the said street so condemned extends, shall first convey the same, by a good and sufficient deed, approved of by the Counsellor of the City, to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and on such conveyance being made and duly recorded, it shall be the duty of the City Commissioners to cause the said street, as condemned, laid down on the plat of the City.
