REGISTER'S SUMMARY.

To the First and Second Branches
Of the City Council of Baltimore,

GENTLEMEN:

In compliance with an Ordinance prescribing the duties of the Register, approved May 25th, 1838, I have the honor herewith to present a statement of receipts and disbursements, on account of the City Corporation, during the year eighteen hundred and thirty-nine.

In reference to the amount of interest received from the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company, it is proper to remark that in addition to the amount (in cash) received from said company, as stated in the Summary, which accompanies this communication, I have also received a Bond of the State of Maryland, bearing five per cent. interest from the first day of October, 1839, for the sum of \$35,000, in accordance with an arrangement made by the Commissioners of Finance with the aforesaid company. The amount of this Bond, in addition to the sum received in cash, is in full of interest due to the City by the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company to the first instant.
