EXTRACTS FROM
ACTS OF ASSEMBLY

AND
ORDINANCES

RELATIVE TO THE
INSPECTION OF FLOUR.

AN ORDINANCE for the Inspection of Flour.

SECTION 3. *Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore,* That all bolted wheat flour and every cask thereof brought to the City of Baltimore for sale or exportation, shall, by the manufacturers thereof, be made merchantable, and of due fineness, without any false packing or mixture of coarser, sour, oily, stale or other flour or meal, and the manufacturer or manufacturers and the person or persons offering the same for sale or inspection, shall each forfeit and pay the sum of five dollars for each and every barrel falsely packed or mixed with coarser, sour, oily, stale or other flour or meal. Penalty for frauds.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted and ordained,* That all flour brought to the City of Baltimore for sale or exportation, shall be submitted to the view and examination of the Inspectors as aforesaid, and shall be examined and inspected in the open air; and it shall not be lawful for the said Inspectors to examine and inspect flour in any warehouse or other building whatever, under the penalty of one dollar for each and every barrel so inspected. How to be inspected.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted and ordained,* That all casks containing flour brought to the City of Baltimore for sale or exportation, shall be well made of good seasoned materials, and tightened with ten hoops, sufficiently nailed with four nails in each chine hoop, and three nails in each upper bilge hoop, and of the following dimensions, viz: the staves of all whole barrels twenty-seven inches long, and the diameter of the head seventeen inches; the staves of all half-barrels twenty-two inches in length, and the diameter of the head to be thirteen inches, and all casks truly tared on the same head with the mill brands shall be deemed a merchantable cask, and every miller and bolter of flour shall provide and have a distinguished brand mark of strong impression, and such as cannot easily be erased; with which he shall brand each and every cask of flour before the same shall be removed from the place How casks to be made.
