No. 3.

AN ORDINANCE relating to certain Stock.

The Mayor to receive certain State Stocks.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorised to receive at the par value the six per cent. Maryland Stock, to be issued for the benefit of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company, to the amount of acceptance in favor (of the city,) of the Treasurer of the Western Shore of Maryland.

To be held by Com'rs of Finance.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted and ordained, That said stock, if received, shall be used by the Commissioners of Finance, in such manner as they may deem most advisable in the redemption and purchase of City Stock.

No. 4.

A SUPPLEMENT to the ORDINANCE, entitled, "An Ordinance for the preservation of the Health of the City," approved, May 22, 1838.

Cow stables regulated.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That if any person or persons having a cow yard or cow stable, or other enclosure in which a cow or cows are kept, shall keep or suffer the same to be kept in such manner as that the filth thereof shall become a nuisance in the opinion of the Commissioners of the Board of Health, the person so keeping his or her cow yard, cow stable or other enclosure as aforesaid, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence the sum of one dollar, and the further sum of one dollar for each and every day the same shall be suffered to remain after judgment for the aforesaid penalty shall have been obtained before any Justice of the Peace for the City of Baltimore.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted and ordained, That it be and is hereby made the duty of the Commissioners of Health and each of them in their several districts, to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance by due course of law as in any violation of the ordinance to which this is a supplement.

No. 5.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT to an ORDINANCE, entitled "An Ordinance, to permit the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company to extend branches of said road within the City of Baltimore," approved, April 25th, 1831.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Mayor shall be and he is hereby authorised to convey by a proper deed to the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company, without any pecuniary consideration, the eastern half of the square of ground situated on the City Block, and bounded on the north by Alisanna street, on the east by Exeter street, on the south by Lancaster street, and on the west by Albemarle street, and likewise one half acre of the lot of ground situated on Monument and Madison streets, to be laid off on the west end and extending easterly to a point that with a right angle with Monument street and extending to Madison street, (exclusive of Grover street, which street is reserved to the city for a public thoroughfare,) will contain said one-half acre of said lot, for the purpose of erecting thereon depots for the use of said Company: Provided always, and it is the true intent and meaning of this ordinance of the property aforesaid, shall be made and excepted upon the express condition and in trust that the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company shall forever use the property so conveyed as and for a place of deposit of goods, wares and merchandise connected with their principal road, by a line of railway; and unless it is so used within one year after the execution of the deed or deeds, or if at any time it should cease to be so used for the space of six months, then and in either of those cases, the deed or deeds to be utterly null and void: Provided also, nevertheless, that said Company shall have liberty to remove any and all the buildings and improvements thereon by them erected, if so done within six months after the expiration of the said six months so allowed them.

Mayor to convey a lot of ground on the City Block to Balt and Sus. R. R. Co.; also half-acre lot of ground on Monument St.

Condition.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted and ordained, That the acceptance of the provisions of this ordinance by the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company shall be considered as an entire and absolute release of the city from the obligation contained in the first section of an ordinance, approved April 25th, 1831, entitled, an ordinance to permit the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company to extend the branches of said road within the city of Baltimore.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted and ordained, That all ordinances and parts of ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Repeal of former ordinances.
