A SUPPLEMENT to an ORDINANCE, entitled, "An Ordinance for the due performance of Quarantine at the Port of Baltimore."

Appropriation for the prevention of contagious diseases.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore*, That the sum of five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated, for the purpose of defraying any expenses that may be necessarily incurred in preventing the introduction of contagious diseases into the City.—The above sum to be expended by the Health Commissioners under the direction of the Mayor.

Masters of vessels to provide for support of passengers whilst at quarantine.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted and ordained*, That from and after the passage of this Ordinance, all passengers placed under quarantine, whether detained on board of ship, or removed on shore, as the Health officer may direct, who shall fail to maintain themselves, shall be provided for by the master of the vessel in which they shall have arrived.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted and ordained*, That if the master shall omit so to provide for them, the expense of their maintenance shall be charged to the vessel in which they shall have arrived, and such vessel shall not be permitted to leave the quarantine ground, until such expense shall have been repaid, or secured to be repaid, in a manner satisfactory to the Mayor.

A SUPPLEMENT to an ORDINANCE to provide for the opening of that part of Parkin street, lying between Hollins street and Pratt street, in the City of Baltimore.

Parkin street.

*Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore*, That the second section of Ordinance No. 17, approved, March 20, 1839, to which this is a supplement, be so altered and amended as to strike out the figures 1837, and insert the figures 1827, according to the original intention of the City Councils in passing said Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE to open and extend Bank street, from Exeter street to Canal street.

Bank street, provision for opening.

WHEREAS Justina Bandel and others have made application for the opening of Bank street from Exeter street to Canal street, and have caused at least sixty days notice in two daily newspapers in the City of Baltimore, of such application, Therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore*, That Samuel Wilson, Doctor Charles S. Davis and Seth Pollard be and they are hereby constituted and appointed Commissioners for opening Bank street, from Exeter street to Canal street, to be of the same width as laid down on Poppleton's Plat, by the Commissioners appointed under the Acts of Assembly of 1816, chapter 38, and 1817, chapter 148.

Com'rs appointed.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted and ordained*, That if a vacancy or vacancies shall occur in said board of Commissioners, by death or resignation or the refusal of them or either of them to act, the Mayor shall forthwith fill such vacancy or vacancies by other and new appointment or appointments.

Mayor to fill vacancies.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted and ordained*, That the said Commissioners shall proceed in all respects agreeably to the acts passed at December session 1826, chapter 91, and the act passed at December session 1827, chapter 21, and shall receive the same compensation therein provided, and the Collector of the city shall perform like duties and be entitled to the same pro rata compensation for such services or duty in relation to the opening of said street, that is required of and provided for him by the acts aforesaid; and the Register of the city shall perform like duties to those required of him in said acts, and be allowed such compensation as the Commissioners aforesaid shall deem proper, and the owners of any property to be taken for the purposes of this ordinance or street may be assessed as benefited by the opening of said street, shall have the same right of appeal to Baltimore City Court, and trial by Jury therein as is provided for the owners of property in said act.

Register's duty.

Appeals.

SEC. 4. *And be enacted and ordained*, That the Petitioners aforesaid, shall enter into such bond and security as the Mayor shall approve to indemnify the city from any loss or damage which may be incurred by the operations of this ordinance: *Provided*, that the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore do not interfere with the ordinary process of the law.

Petitioners to indemnify the city.
