AN ADDITIONAL SUPPLEMENT to an ORDINANCE, No. 11, entitled, "An Ordinance to preserve the Health of the City of Baltimore."

Ordinadce 11, Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and passed 1838 re- City Council of Baltimore, That Ordinance No. 11, entitled, "An Ordinance to preserve the Health of the City of Baltimore," approved, May 22, 1838, he and the same is hereby reinstated in all its provisions, to be in full force and virtue from and after the passage of this Ordinance.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted and ordained, That from and after the period when the City shall have been divided into fourteen Wards, there shall be appointed seven regular practising Physicians for the same purpose, and subject to the same regulations, and entitled to the same rateable compensation as provided for in the appointment of six Physicians, in the 9th section of the Ordinance to which this is a supplement, and the same shall be divided into seven districts, according to the provisions of the 9th section aforesaid.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted and ordained, That the Consulting Physician shall receive for his services, the sum of two hundred dollars per annum; anything in any Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding.

AN ORDINANCE relating to Bloom street, between Pennsylvania avenue and Ross street.

Conditions for Be it enacied and ordained by the Mayor and City Council closing part of of Baltimore, That unless application shall be made to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, agreeably to the act of Assembly, passed at December session, 1816, chapter 218, and December session, 1817, chapter 148, before the first day February, 1844, for opening that part of Bloom street, between Pennsylvania avenue and Ross street, in the City Baltimore, as laid down on Poppleton's plat, the proprietors of ground whereon Bloom street is located on said plat, between Pennsylvania avenue and Ross street aforesaid, may build upon, improve and use the same, and shall have the same rights, privileges and claims for compensation or otherwise, for or in respect of any buildings, improvements or uses, as if the same had been made or put up before the passing of the acts of Assembly above recited.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council Appointment of Baltimore, That in this year all the City Officers, whose of City Officers nominations have not been finally acted on, may be appointed at any time during the annual session, and shall enter upon the discharge of the duties of their respective offices on the day next succeeding his or their appointment, anything in any Ordinance heretofore passed to the contrary notwithstanding.

AN ORDINANCE for the appointment of a Collector of the City of Baltimore and prescribing his duties.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Collect-City Council of Baltimore, That there shall be annually ap- or appointed. pointed a Collector of all taxes which shall be hereafter imposed by the Corporation of the City of Baltimore, or by its authority; who, before he enters upon the duties of his office, shall give bond to the Corporation with security, to be approved by the Mayor and the Presidents of the two Branches of the City Council, or any two of them, the Mayor being one, in the penal sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, conditioned for the true and faithful performance of the trust reposed in him and of the duties required of him by the Acts of Assembly or Ordinances of the City of Baltimore, heretofore passed or to be passed; and for the payment on each and every Monday to the Register or to such other officer or officers, person or persons, as may be authorised to receive the same, of such sum and sums of money as he may have received in the course of his collections—and the said Collector, at the time of mak-
