For rebuilding the culvert over Schroeder's run at Pratt street, and repairing the street—the abutments to be at least two feet six inches thick, of large flat stone, and the arch at least one foot six inches deep, of the best hard flat stonethe abutments to rest on timbers, laid on a solid bed of clay the entire width, the old materials to be used in building wing and parapet walls, the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars.

For repairing the culvert over Tanner's run at Pratt street, and repairing the pavement of the street—the abutments and arch to be built of hard brick, laid in hydraulic cement, and resting on timbers the entire width of the abutments,—the old materials to be used in building wing and parapet walls, the sum of one hundred dollars.

For repairing the abutments of the bridge over Schroeder's run at Saratoga street, fifty dollars.

For repairing the abutment walls, laying new floor and floor timbers for the bridge over Schroeder's run at Lombard street, one hundred dollars.

For repairing the culvert over Schroeder's run at Franklin street, and repaving the street—the abutments to rest on timber the entire width of the culvert, and the stones of the arch to be flat, and not less than one foot six inches deep, the old materials to be used in building wing and parapet walls, three hundred dollars.

For repairing the planking and abutments of the bridge over Schroeder's run at Lexington street, seventy-five dollars.

For rebuilding the south end, and repairing the entire tunnel at the intersection of Fremont and Columbia streets, including the timber for the bottom, in the most substantial manner, fifteen hundred dollars.

## Resolution relating to pay of Assessors.

Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Register be and he is hereby directed, with the approbation of the Mayor, to pay to each of the Assessors the sum of seventy-five dollars on the rendition of the field notes of each ward, on account of compensation specified in ordinance No. 71, approved May 14, 1846; to be paid out of any monies in treasury not otherwise appropriated.

#### Resolution for repairing certain Tunnels, Sewers, &c.

Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That Run alley tunnel be continued to Pearl street under the direction of the city commissioners, and they are hereby directed to erect inlets in such places and of such dimensions as, in their opinion, will convey the water from the adjoining streets to said tunnel; the top of the inlets to be covered with cast iron, and the bottom of said tunnel to be of logs, from Lexington street to the end of the same.

And be it further resolved, That the city commissioners be and they are hereby directed to place a good and substantial inlet to Chatsworth tunnel, at the north-east corner of Saratoga and Chatsworth streets, of such dimensions as they may believe will convey the water from the street to the tunnel; and one other inlet at the north-west corner of Saratoga and Chatsworth streets, of like dimensions,—and enlarge the inlet at the south-east corner of said streets, so as to receive the water from the adjoining property; also enlarge the inlet in Vine near Pine street, and the inlet on the south side of Vine street, near Run alley, -and enlarge the inlets at the intersection of Canal and Orleans streets, and the inlets at the intersection of Pitt and Canal streets, so as to convey the water more rapidly into Hartord run; and erect a new inlet at Harford run, in Little Hampstead street; and enlarge the sewers at the intersection of Bath and Holliday streets; and properly repair the walls on Harford run; and have the dams or flood gates now in said run removed; and properly repair Bower's sewer, and the sewer commencing in Holliday street near Saratoga street, running into Jones' falls; the tops of all said inlets to be covered with cast iron.
