Resolutions relative to an Iron Bridge over Jones' Falls at Monument and Madison streets.

Resolved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the sum of five hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated, and the Register is hereby authorised, with the approbation of the Mayor, to pay the same to the order of the city commissioners, in addition to the two thousand dollars heretofore appropriated by resolution No. 153, approved May 23d, 1846, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pay the city's proportional part of the cost of an iron bridge to be constructed upon the plan of Mr. Howe's patent, as presented by J. R. Trimble, with his proposal to the city commissioners—provided, however, the provisions and stipulations as specified in the aforementioned resolutions, be complied with by the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company.
