An Ordinance relating to the Markets.

Females may Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and sell merchan-dise in the City Council of Baltimore, That none of the ordinances of the corporation, forbidding the sale of merchandize within the limits of the markets, shall hereafter be construed to extend or apply to the case of any female bona fide engaged in Stock in trade the business of selling on her own account, and whose stock not to exceed in trade, offered for sale within the limits aforesaid, shall at no

time exceed the sum of one hundred dollars in value. SEC. 2. And be it further enacted and ordained, That any female bona fide engaged in such business on her own account, shall have the privilege of selling, subject to the limitation expressed in the first section, any merchandize within the limits of the several markets,—any thing in any ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding.

An Ordinance to provide for Cleaning the Streets, Lanes and Alleys in the City of Baltimore.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and health to em- City Council of Baltimore, That the board of health be and ploy men, hor- they are hereby authorized and directed, with the approbation of the Mayor, to employ as many men, horses and carts, and provide such implements as may be necessary for cleaning and effectually keeping in good order and free from nuisance, the streets, lanes and alleys within the city.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted and ordained, That the board of The city to be health aforesaid shall divide the city into as many districts as divided into they may find necessary, not exceeding six in number, and apportion a sufficient number of men, horses and carts to each district, and one superintendent to each district, which super- Superintendintendent so appointed, shall be required to keep a correct ac- ents. count of the number of days labor performed by each man in his district,—also of the number of loads of manure or dirt removed by each horse and cart, and the place where such manure or dirt has been deposited, and render such account Duties. under oath to the board of health on Monday of each and every week; for which additional service, said superintendent shall be paid fifty cents per day over and above the amount paid to the other hands.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted and ordained, That the board City bailiffs of health shall have full power and authority to require the and police of-city bailiffs and police officers to aid and assist them in carrying into effect the provisions of this ordinance.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted and ordained, That there shall 10,000 dollars be annually appropriated, such an amount of money as may annually apbe necessary, not exceeding ten thousand dollars, to carry in- propriated. to effect the provisions of this ordinance, which money, so appropriated, with the amount obtained from the sales of manure, shall be subject to the order of the board of health, countersigned by the Mayor.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted and ordained, That so much of Repeal. the ordinance No. 64, approved May the 2d, 1846, as provides for the appointment of three superintendents of streets and pumps, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. 6. And be it enacted and ordained, That all ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed.
