RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES.

The Report of the Treasurer exhibits an account of the receipts and expenditures during the year. The expenditures for all purposes amount to \$124,012,09. This includes part payment on two school houses that were built in 1854, and two that were erected the present year, beside the alterations and repairs of the buildings occupied by Male Gammar School No. 3, and the building on Anne street, occupied by Male and Female Primary School, No. 6. The receipts from the City Register amount to \$100,058,95, which is considerably less than was estimated to be provided by the City Council; after deducting from the estimate, a number of School Houses, the building of which
