An ordinance to provide for Grading, Paving and Kerbing McElderry street, between Burke and Cannon streets.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the City Commissioner be and he is hereby authorized and directed to have all that part of McElderry street, between Burke and Cannon streets, graded, paved to be graded, and kerbed, in pursuance of the Act of Assembly, chapter 218. of 2d April, 1874, and according to the provisions of ordinance No. 44, of 4th June, 1874, providing for the grading, graveling, shelling, kerbing and paving of streets, lanes or alleys of the city of Baltimore, so far as the same may be applicable; the work to be done at the expense of the property owners along the lines of the street where said work shall be done.

An ordinance providing for the Appointment of an additional Harbor Master.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to appoint, as other city officers are appointed, some competent person, who shall perform the duties of a Harbor Master Harbor Master, as prescribed by the requirements of the Baltimore City Code, in that portion of the harbor of this city known as the South-West and Middle branches of the Patapsco river.

Sec. 2. Be it enacted, That it shall be the duty Duty of Harbor of the said Harbor Master to make a monthly Master.
