An ordinance to provide for Dredging the Basin at the Mouths

Whereas, large quantities of sediment are deposited in the basin at the mouths of sewers connected therewith, in consequence of which the owners and occupants of wharf property are injured and their business impeded; therefore,

Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That it shall be the duty of the Harbor Board from time to time, when remove sediment the same shall be necessary, to remove the depossise of sediment at the mouths of sewers entering into the basis in reduction or dained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That it shall be the into the basin, in order to prevent the accumula-tion thereof from injuring the property or impe-ding the business operations of all persons contiguous thereto.

An ordinance supplementary to the ordinance to appoint a Comptroller of the City of Baltimore, and prescribing his

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Chief Clerk of the department of the City Comptroller shall be required to execute to the Mayor Clerks in Departant and City Council, a good and sufficient bond, to troller to give be approved by the Mayor and Comptroller, and certified by the City Solicitor, for the sum of five thousand dollars, conditioned for the faithful discharge of the duties of his office; and that the other clerks in said office shall, in the same manner or form, give good and sufficient bond in the sum of two thousand dollars.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted and ordained, That in the event of the necessary absence of the City Comptroller from his office from sickness or any other cause, the Chief Clerk may, by obtaining the written certified authority of the Mayor, which Chief Clerk to certificate must, on each day that the Comptroller Comptroller. upon written aumay be absent, be renewed, issue warrants to the thority of the City Register, authorizing the receiving of monies for the use of the city, or draw warrants on that office for the payment of claims against the city; provided the City Register may, if he should entertain doubts as to the validity of such claim, suspend the payment of the same until such time as the Comptroller may resume the duties of his
