An Ordinance to provide for the grading, paving and kerbing of McElderry street between Chester and Wolfe streets.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the City Commissioner be and he is hereby authorized and directed to have all that part of McElderry street between Chester and Wolfe streets graded, paved and kerbed, in pursuance of the Act of Assembly, Chapter 218, of April 2, 1874, and according to the provisions of Article 47, of the Baltimore City Code, title "Streets and City Commissioner," sub-title "Grades, Grading, Paving, &c.," providing for the grading, graveling, shelling, kerbing, paving, re-paving, &c., of streets, lanes and alleys in the city of Baltimore, so far as the same may be applicable; the expense thereof to be assessed, as provided in said Article 47, Section 34, in regard to paving and re-paving done under the provisions of said article, upon the owners of property binding on said street in proportion to the number of front feet owned by them respectively on the portion of said street hereby directed to be paved.
