An Ordinance to provide for issuing the stock of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and to sell the same for the purpose of providing the means to enable the Western Maryland Railroad Company to pay and extinguish all of its first and second preferred mortgage bonds and the overdue coupons thereon, except such of said bonds and coupons as are held by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and to pay and extinguish all the bonds of said company secured by its second mortgage and guaranteed by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and by the County Commissioners of Washington county respectively, and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption

Whereas, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore are bound as guarantors for the payment of the principal and interest of \$875,000 of the bonds of the Western Maryland Railroad Company, bearing interest at Preamble. the rate of 6 per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually, secured by a mortgage from the Western Maryland Railroad Company to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, bearing date the first day of July, 1870; and

Whereas, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore have also loaned the said company \$1,000,000 of the stock of the said Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, bearing interest semi-annually at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum, payable on the first day of January, 1902, secured by a mortgage Preamble. from said railroad company to the Mayor and City Council, dated April 3, 1872, to indemnify the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore on account of its liability for the principal and interest of said stock; and
