An Ordinance to provide for grading, paving and kerbing Gold street, between the northeast side of Pennsylvania avenue and the southwest side of Division street, and also between the northeast side of Druid Hill avenue and the southwest side of Madison avenue.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the City Commissioner be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to have all those parts of Gold street, lying between the northeast side of Pennsylvania avenue and the southwest side of Division street, and also between the northeast side of Druid Hill avenue and the southwest side of Madison avenue, graded, paved and kerbed, To grade, pave in pursuance of the Acts of Assembly, Chapter 219 of the Acts of 1892, and according to the provisions of the existing ordinance providing for the grading, graveling, shelling, kerbing, paving, repaving, &c., of streets, lanes and alleys in the City of Baltimore, so far as the same may be applicable; and the expense thereof to be assessed as provided in Ordinance No. 33, approved March 14th, 1893, entitled "An ordinance to add additional sections to Article XLVII of the City Code, in relation to the paving, repaving, &c., of streets, lanes and alleys," and in the ordinance amending said last mentioned ordinance, being Ordinance No. 50, approved March 24th, 1893, and entitled "An ordinance to repeal and re-enact Section 61 a, in Section 1 of an ordinance approved March 14th, 1893, and entitled 'An ordinance to add additional sections to Article

judgment of the said Commissioners a part only of the whole of a lot or a part of the whole of the improvements on any lot can be taken without destroying the whole of said lot or said improvements for the purpose for which lot or improvements are used or for building purposes, then said Commissioner, shall only condemn such part of said whole lot or improvements as is necessary for the proposed object, and shall award to the owner or owners of the part of the lot or improvements so taken such damages and assess upon the remainder thereof such benefits as in their judgment shall be right and proper; and provided, further, that in all cases where there are sheds or other obstructions lying and being in the beds of streets, lanes, roads or alleys in process of opening or widening, where the same will not in the judgment of the Commissioners for Opening Streets sell by public auction for the amount of the expenses of said sale, then the said Commissioners for Opening Streets may, and they are hereby, authorized to sell the same at private sale.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted and ordained, That all ordinances and parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance, be, and hereby are, repealed.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted and ordained, That this ordinance shall take effect from the date of its passage.
