An ordinance to provide for the repaving of Lombard street, from the east side of Stricker street to the west side of Gilmor street; Gilmor street, from the north side of Lombard street to the south side of Hollins street; Hollins street, from the west side of Gilmor street to the east side of Stricker street; and Stricker street, from the south side of Hollins street to the north side of Lombard street with 3-inch asphalt blocks on a concrete base, and to reset and redress the kerb.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the City Engineer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to have all that part of Lombard street from the east side of Stricker street to the west side of Gilmor street, and all that part of Gilmor street from the north side of Lombard street to the south side of Hollins street; and all that part of Hollins street from the west side of Gilmor street to the east side of Stricker street; and all that part of Stricker street from the south side of Hollins street to the north side of Lombard street, repaved with 3-inch asphalt blocks on a concrete base, and to reset and redress the kerb; all of said work shall be done in accordance with specifications to be prepared by the Advertisement City Engineer, who shall advertise for proposals for doing the entire work.

SEC. 2. And be it further ordained, That the whole cost of repaving, resetting and redressing the kerb of the portions of the streets named in the first section of this ordinance, shall be borne and paid by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and that the sum of nineteen thousand (\$19,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appro-priated to defray the cost of the same;

money.

SEC. 2. And be it further ordained, That all the old material on said portion of East North avenue, which it shall be necessary to take up and remove, shall be removed by the contractor at his expense, and shall therefore and thereupon become his prop-

SEC. 3. And be it further ordained, That the City Engineer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to make monthly estimates on the completed work on the said portion of the said East North avenue, and to draw his order on the City Comptroller for eighty (80) per cent. each, respec. tively, of such estimates in favor of said contractor, and that when the whole work provided for in this ordinance is finished and accepted by the City Engineer, all sums then remaining unpaid shall be paid to the contractor.
