An ordinance authorizing the Collector of Water Rents and Licenses to appoint assistants and clerks, and fixing their salaries and prescribing their duties.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Collector of Water Rents and Licenses is hereby authorized to appoint to aid him in the discharge of his duties the following assistants and clerks, at the following sala-

Salaries.

One General Bookkeeper, at a salary of fourteen hundred (\$1,400) dollars per anORDINANCES.

One Cashier, at a salary of fourteen hundred (\$1,400) dollars per annum.

One License Clerk, at a salary of twelve hundred (\$1,200) dollars per annum.

One Chief Clerk, at a salary of thirteen hundred (\$1,300) dollars per annum.

One Water Clerk, at a salary of twelve hundred (\$1,200) dollars per annum.

Eight Ledger Clerks, at a salary of twelve hundred (\$1,200) dollars each per annum.

Four Inspectors and Bill Distributors, at a salary of one thousand (\$1,000) each per annum.

SEC. 2. Be it further ordained, That the said assistants and clerks shall hold their respective positions during the pleasure of Collector. the Collector of Water Rents and Licenses, and shall execute such bond, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of their respective offices, as shall, in the judgment of the Collector of Water Rents and Licenses, be proper, said bond to be approved by the Mayor; and shall perform such duties as are now performed by those holding the same respective positions by virtue of Resolution 16 of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, approved March 12, 1900; and shall, in addition, perform such other duties as may be prescribed from time to time by the said Collector of Water Rents and Licenses.
