 attested properly. If you bring or order any Fillys to be shipped for
 Maryland, they must not be brought in Stings, but stung in y^e
 Hold of y^e Ship on Shingle Ballast, they will naturally hum out
 y^e motion of y^e Ship, Stings may be provided in case of very
 violent weather, but even in such weather I question whether it
 will be necessary to use them. M^r Dulany brought over a Mare in
 Stings, she was shipped in fine order & was Landed a Shelton; M^r
 Tackitts Mare was very poor when shipped, she was not put in Stings
 & was Landed in good order. I enclosed you have an estimate of the
 charges attending y^e passage of a Horse or Mare for y^e direction.
 If you sh^d. purchase aged Mares with any blemishes by accidents
 M^r Dulany gave me many Instances of such of y^e best blood
 being bought for 20 Guineas, let them be covered by some noted
 Horse before they are shipped. You forgot to send me y^e natural
