The Langley Estate went off early by Roger Lee, very valuable
The Rodele Estate remains unaccounted for, also valuable
The Coked Estate supposed to be in Derbyshire also unaccounted for
The Astley Estate, the Coton Estate, & the Aordley Estate
united formed 3000 acres, and were handed down till 1786 -
when 1400 acres were sold - of Astley & Aordley - The manorial
rights remain and the Priory site of the Village of Allerby

part of the Coton Estate now in possession included
a part of the Astley Estate which came into, & remained
with this family since Robert Lee's marriage with
Margaret Astley in 1385, now 434 years.

Allerby Church is supposed to be built upon land
given by Hugh Hinton to John Lee in 1295 - 26.2.1000
and to have remained in this family for more than 524 years
and a part of this land is said to have remained with
the family since the first grant from William of
