Doughorsey 36th June 1829

I received on the 28th your letter of the 26th and
one from Mr Th^o Shaw of the same date informing
me of y^r deposit of \$226 $\frac{71}{100}$ which is your
proportion of the ^{year's} interest due from the estate
of the late Th^o Sim Lee 29th of last August

Have you heard of the arrival
of Mr John Lee at New Orleans, are all
the negroes ship it for that port safely landed,
has Mr Lee bought any land fit for raising
sugars, in short are his speculations ^{promising}
At your convenience you will oblige me
by giving information respecting the
above matters.
