When the wagon pulls in, filled with magic potions and crystal balls, "The 5th Dimension Traveling Sunshine Show" arrives on ABC, for a musical special next Wednesday (Aug. 18) (8:30-9:30, EDT).

The guest stars conjured up by the talented 5th Dimension are Dionne Warwick, The Carpenters and Merle Haggard.

The first number on the roster of upbeat, lavishly produced songs is "Light Sings," a new 5th Dimension hit. That's followed by "Rainmaker," which features Billy Davis Jr. It's an almost gospel-like song done with the other members of the group filling in as the chorus.

The Carpenters, the brother and sister team now featured in the summer television series "Make Your Own Kind of Music," sing "Reason to Believe," and, later in the show, "Superstar."

Dionne Warwick with 5th Dimension girls Marilyn McCoo and Florence LaRue Gordon go through a medley of their hits that ends with the trio singing "She's A Lady." Dionne's solos include "Games People Play," and "Reach Out and Touch Somebody's Hand."

Some of the other numbers offered by the 5th Dimension include "Pagliacci," featuring Ron Townson, Marilyn McCoo and Rhymes, Florence LaRue Gordon doing "Joy to the World," and the whole group in a medley of their past hits.

Included among the musical highlights will be a 5th Dimension medley of: "Up, Up and Away," "Wedding Bell Blues," "Aquarius/Let the Sun Shine In," "One Less Bell," and "Stoned Soul Picnic."
